Managed Vessel Grounded off Hachinohe (1)

Crimson Polaris, a dedicated wood-chip carrier managed by Misuga Kaiun Co., Ltd., was swept away by a

strong wind while anchored and resultantly ran aground off Hachinohe in Aomori prefecture at around 7:35 am

(JST) on August 11. Afterward, the hull of the vessel split into two at 4:15 am on August 12, and oil from the

vessel has spilled into the ocean. The quantity of spilled oil is under investigation.

All crew members have been evacuated from the ship before the split and confirmed that they are safe.

Currently, the split hull is floating about 4km offshore, and Japan Coast Guard is dealing with it on-site.

The vessel is owned by MI-DAS Line S.A. and managed by Misuga Kaiun Co., Ltd. NYK is currently

chartering this ship from the shipowner.

Misuga Kaiun has organized a crisis management center led by Misuga Kaiun president Masami Iwai to address

the situation rapidly. In addition, Company personnel has been sent to the site. Furthermore, we are working

with the Japan Coast Guard and relevant authorities and other parties concerned, including the shipowner and

charterer, and making every effort to solve the situation as soon as possible.
